EAT Pennines is a social enterprise that has an impact on the employability and well-being of young people by providing accredited training and apprenticeship programmes in the hospitality and catering industry.

We operate from Eagle + Child, Ramsbottom, EAT at Heaton Park and Contour Homes, Didsbury.

Our new traineeship programme was launched in October 2014 in partnership with Babington Group. In just over 18 months, we have supported 37 young people into a traineeship programme with a cumulative success rate of 75%.

Our aim is to support 60 disadvantaged young people into employment by the end of March 2017.

1: EAT Pennines works collaboratively in partnership with local authorities, colleges and further education institutions towards improving the employability of young people in the North West. Together, we provide work place experience, accredited apprenticeships and employability training for local young people (aged 16-25).

2: Over the last 4 years, EAT Pennines has provided over 40,000 hours of training and completed apprenticeships and vocational training programmes for a total of 61 young people.

3: The traineeship programme provides a comprehensive, 26 week work experience and training programme to up to 12 young people at a time.

4: 61 young people have commenced apprenticeships or accredited training with EAT Pennines. 80% have already gained Level 1 qualifications and 30% have gone onto Level 2.

6: Our apprentices will deliver nearly 50,000 hours of work across a range of service industry areas in the first year.

7: EAT Pennines also works with local colleges including Babington Group, Hopwood Hall and Bury College to offer accreditation alongside work experience.

EAT Pennines is a company Limited by Guarantee and has been trading since October 2011. The business was originally established within a pub, Eagle & Child (E&C). Glen Duckett, the founder and CEO of EAT, has grown E&C from a boarded up and derelict pub, into an award winning gastro pub. In addition to being run as a traditional pub, it provides training and apprenticeship places through EAT.

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
